Tree Planting Mission with Bridgewater Township, NJ

AFNA celebrated Arbor Day on Oct 17th, 2015 in the township of Bridgewater, NJ by performing community planting of trees. The tree planting ceremony was performed in honor of Padmashree Jadav Payeng, the Forest Man of India. The Mayor of Bridgewater Township also planted a tree and dedicated a plaque in Jadav's honor. It was a big step forward to honor Jadav Payeng and build awareness about the soil erosion and flood problem in Majuli, Assam and his single handed effort to reverse deforestation.

The tree planting and its maintenance is a sustainable effort done with the cooperation of the township of Bridgewater in New Jersey, USA. As part of continued partnership, AFNA participated in the Bridgewater Township's Eco-Blast Sustainability fair in May 7th, 2016 to reiterate our message about sustainability and efforts towards reforestation.





Disaster Relief: Nepal & Italy Earthquakes

AFNA has pulled up resources from the small Assamese community and donated \$1000 to Italian American Relief Org towards rebuilding efforts in Italy after the Earthquake in Aug 25, 2016. Similarly, right after the devastating earthquake in Nepal, in April, 2015, AFNA raised \$1676 from our volunteers and community members and donated to Save The Children. Save The Children was working directly in Nepal for the relief and rehabilitation work.

This is in line with our strategy to extend humanitarian relief for disasters across the globe. AFNA in the past has extended similar help for tsunami & typhoon victims in Japan and Phillipines, tornado victims in midwest USA.

Focus Area: Education (General)

AKADAMICS Program

<u>Challenge</u>: Academically capable students in Assam were unable to start or continue their college education due to poverty

Action taken: AFNA initiated AKADAMICS program to identify college going students and support their college education and provide mentoring. The students (both boys and girls) were carefully selected by a respected selection board based on detailed written applications.

Impact: AFNA has expanded from 27 scholarship. The scholarships of those 27 students are assured by AFNA for the duration of their degree programs to ensure completion



Support A Child (SAC) Program

<u>Challenge</u>: Children were at risk of dropping out of school due to family poverty

Action taken: Under this flagship project of AFNA, financial assistance has been provided to 75 students in 2016. Depending on the need, the amount varied with a general budget of around \$100 per student per year.

Impact: The stipends helped SHED to support 23 residential students with disabilities and provide food and shelter. It also helped Tapoban to arrange for regular physiotherapy sessions for the 30 residential students with disabilities. Additional 25 children were provided with stipends to enable and encourage them to continue school education.

Focus Area: Education (Special)

SHED integrated school

<u>Challenge:</u> SHED, a school for disabled children outside Guwahati needed to move to a permanent location with better facilities

Action taken: Over the years, AFNA raised funds for more than \$10000 to help SHED procure land and build infrastructure. Additional ongoing assistance provided through AFNA's SAC program

Impact: SHED moved to its own land and is slowly building the infrastructure for its integrated school. Currently it is hosting 23 residential students and serves a total 63 students.



Shishu Sarothi

<u>Challenge</u>: Children with special needs does not have adequate avenues of learning. Shishu Sarothi that runs a day training center for such kids needed specials chairs for students with Cerebral Palsy

Action taken: AFNA matched donation from its general fund with a donation from one of our anchor donors, and provided Shishu Sarothi a grant of \$1000 to procure such chairs.

<u>Impact</u>: Centre for Special Education at Shishu Sarothi procured 8 such chairs that helped them to accommodate 8 more kids on top of their existing 22 seats.



Focus Area: Employment Generation

Atma Nirbhar Ek Challenge(ANeC) & Support a Disabled Worker (SADW)

<u>Challenge</u>: ANEC in Guwahati needed help with their work to provide financial security to disabled adults to work and live productive lives

Action taken: As in prior years, AFNA donated \$2800 to ANEC to help support its workers who do packaging of tea and other food items

Impact: ANEC was able to continue supporting 39 disabled adults with customized work in packaging to lead dignified lives



Swabalambi & Training Artisans with Disabilities

<u>Challenge</u>: Disabled master artisans could not travel from their homes to teach their skills to other disabled adults in Dimoria block in Kamrup district

Action taken: 8 physically handicapped master artisans were given a stipend by Swabalambi with \$4800 donated by AFNA

<u>Impact</u>: Over 50 other disabled artisans were able to get regular training from these master artisans so that they can learn crucial skills necessary to ensure livelihood.
