AFNA just awarded scholarships and financial assistances to 30 resident students of Tapoban in Pathsala, Assam. Based out of Pathsala, run by Students Welfare Mission, TAPOBAN is providing services in the field of disability, abandoned child, orphan child and underprivileged child. Tapoban has been a long partner of AFNA working towards our shared goal of spreading education and finally making them ready for life and livelihood. We are happy to provide \$3000 under our Support A Child (SAC) program that will help Tapoban to provide professional physiotherapists for these students in need.

AFNA is happy to be part of the Homeswar Dev Choudhuri Memorial Scholarships provided to students of Patacharkucchi Girl's High School in Patacharkucchi, Assam. Initiated and coordinated by Rathin Dev Choudhury of North Carolina, we selected 25 students on recommendation of the Head Mistress of the school based on merit and financial need; AFNA has funded a total of \$625 for the scholarships under our SAC program.

Engaging local communities with AFNA at Bridgetown, NJ

Last year AFNA started a Fall Tree Planting ceremony in the town of Bridgewater, NJ in honor of Padma Shri Jaday "Molai" Payeng. He is known as the Forest Man, one- man creator of some 1400-plus acres of sprawling forest to prevent land erosion in the river island of Majuli in Assam, India. The tree planting and its maintenance is a sustainable effort done with the co-operation of the township of Bridgewater in New Jersey, USA. As a continuation of this project AFNA participated at the Eco-Blast Sustainability Fair at Bridgewater, New Jersey on May 7, 2016; this Fair has been a trademark for the township to mark the sustainability aspect of the town. AFNA was invited by the Township of Bridgewater to participate at the fair and our volunteers Niren Choudhury displayed our projects and inform people of Bridgewater about our work in Assam and work related to sustainability like the Tree Planting ceremony. Eco-Blast fair included exhibits and interactive environmental and sustainable displays from businesses, clubs and non-profit organizations, eco-friendly children's craft, live music and exhibit of eco-friendly electric cars along with taste of local mouthwatering foods. A good number of local people including the mayor of Bridgewater visited our booth and showed interest in our ongoing projects giving AFNA some visibility among the local communities. We were happy to have new volunteers signed up to work for AFNA's work related to the environmental causes. This kind of engagement with the local communities will help AFNA to continue our Fall Tree Planting ceremony. We were happy to see several local Assamese families join our booth during the fair.
