Work-An-Hour Campaign for Spring 2019

Back in old days in Assam, our mothers, while putting rice to cook for the family dinner, used to keep a handful out in a separate pot that was used to donate to the needy. This practice was called "musti daan" or a "handful of donation". Today, this practice still continues but in a more symbolic way. We no longer keep a separate pot to keep rice aside, but we just set aside some money that would be equivalent price for the food and then donate it.

Work-An-Hour works in a similar way. We request our volunteers that they help us carry out our projects. Or spend at least an hour on our project. Now with us being so far away from Assam, it is not always possible. Instead, we urge you to donate an hour's wage that we earn while carrying out our professional duties. That way, it is an hour in our life when we are not working to feed our own needs but to earn it for AFNA's project.

Support a Child (SAC) project updates for 2019

AFNA has initiated the disbursement of the following Support A Child scholarships for the year 2019:

- I) \$3000 to Society for Health & Education (SHED)
- II) \$625 to Patacharkuchi High School (PKHS)
- III) \$3000 to Tapoban

SHED: We grant \$3000 to SHED to supplement their other income to cover for food expenses for their students (boarders & day scholars). SHED is an integrated school with mostly kids of special abilities that also provides accommodation for the needy. It also runs an evening school for the kids of nearby villages for educational enrichments.

PKHS: We partner with Seneh to provide scholarships to 25 girls (\$25 each) in the Patacharkuchi High School on basis of merit as most of the students in the Government High School is from pretty low financial background. This has already been disbursed to the students early in April.

Tapoban: Tapoban receives yearly \$3000 from AFNA's Support A Child scholarships to subsidies the food, teaching & therapy expenses for the 30 boarders in Tapoban. We continue to provide this support to Tapoban.

Successful completion of the elevator project for Tapoban

It was a happy moment for Tapoban & the AFNA family when the elevator for Tapoban was inaugurated on 4th February, 2019. For all of us, it was the result of a dream that came true through the efforts of the volunteers of AFNA working with Tapoban's founder Mr. Kumud Kalita to see that the children in Tapoban can be self-sufficient when they need to move across the floors in Tapoban's newly constructed multi story building.

Tapoban, located in Pathsala, Assam, is a residential school for the students with special needs. It was started in 2005 with 5 students by Mr. Kumud Kalita. Today Tapoban hosts 30 students in its hostel and serves another 70 day scholars who receive special education and training. Most of the hostellers are either orphans or kids abandoned by their family.

AFNA has partnered with Tapoban since 2008 by providing scholarships and financial aids to support the vision for the school. Of late, Tapoban received help from multiple local organizations in Assam due to their good work. Last year, Tapoban started constructing a four story building to accommodate the students and borders. But there was one big hurdle. It did not have the additional funds needed to build an elevator. Without it, the students would have had to rely on the staff to take them up or down the floors. In India, where many struggle with the basic needs, an elevator for accessibility is considered a luxury.

AFNA felt that it is a human right for the students at Tapoban and worked with Mr. Kalita to find out what it takes to add an elevator. Our stewards put up a project proposal costing nearly \$21,000 where AFNA committed to pay 75% of the cost. Rest have been raised by Tapoban. We took the project and pitched it to the community in Assam Convention 2018 and received overwhelming support. One of our volunteers even ran a half marathon to raise additional fund. In total AFNA could meet its funding goal with a HUGE support from our community.

The construction started as planned in October and completed as per plan within 4 months without any cost overrun. Big thanks to Mr. Kalita for diligent execution and to the AFNA volunteers for conducting due diligence on the project plan. The final moment of joy came on the February 4th when the elevator was formally inaugurated in presence of AFNA volunteers, Tapoban family and other local dignitaries.

It surely sets the bar high for continuing and future AFNA projects. We hope to continue this work, spread hope and happiness and get a real value for the money for our donors. Thank you everyone in the North American Assamese community!!
